KEEPING OR STORING OF JUNK, ABANDONED, UNREGISTERED AND UNINSPECTED VEHICLES**§ 10-301. Definitions. [Ord. 302, 8/13/1997, § 1]**

DISABLED — A vehicle not capable of being operated upon the highways of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania due to mechanical failure.

INOPERATIVE — A vehicle not capable of being operated upon the highways of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania due to mechanical, legal or any other condition.

MOTOR VEHICLE — Any type of mechanical device propelled by a motor, in which a person or property may be transported upon public streets or highways, and includes trailers or semi-trailers pulled thereby.

REGISTRATION — A motor vehicle properly registered by the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or by the appropriate registration authority of any other state of the United States.

INSPECTION — A vehicle inspected mechanically and properly certified in accordance with the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to be operated on a roadway of the Commonwealth.

§ 10-302. Parking of Abandoned, Junk, Unregistered, or Uninspected Vehicles. [Ord. 302, 8/13/1997, § 2; as amended by Ord. 323, 9/10/2003, § 1]

1. It shall be unlawful to park, store or leave upon the public streets, parking lots, alleyways or any other private or public property within the Borough of Galeton any disabled or inoperative vehicle for a period of time in excess of 48 hours.
2. It shall be unlawful to park, store or leave upon the public streets, parking lots, alleyways and all privately owned property within the Borough of Galeton any vehicle where the registration and/or inspection of said vehicle has expired more than 60 days prior to the vehicle being found on the public streets, parking lots, alleyways or other privately owned property.

§ 10-303. Penalties. [Ord. 302, 8/13/1997, § 3]

Any person who shall violate any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$600 plus costs and, in default of payment of said fine and costs, to undergo imprisonment for a term not to exceed 30 days. Each day that a violation of this Part continues shall constitute a separate offense.
